Selection*	 Durham PreK will align priorities for selection of children with the NC Pre-K and CCSA Scholarship programs. Priority will be given to the following groups:

	 Durham PreK funded spaces will help create more economically diverse classrooms by opening access for families with income over 100% FPL to enroll.
	• Durham Public Schools get Title I dollars, county sales tax, other assorted federal dollars for children with special
	needs. Additionally, DPS has NC Pre-K classrooms. The long term goal is for DPS to expand the number of 4-year old seats they offer.
	 For PreK enrollment, we have about 800 applications and we are looking for another 300 applications. To increase applications we have tables at various locations, community events, and working with Moms Rising on advertising along with other parent groups.

	 Transportation issues
	 Misconception that preschool isn't free for most families
	○ ICE concerns
	• The application can be a barrier because it asks for sensitive information
	 Before and after care - working parents often need wrap care to accommodate work schedules
	 Perhaps having a disclaimer saying the information provided, "will not be shared" will help with fear about providing sensitive information.
